As we gather around this Thanksgiving table, we want to take a moment to reflect on the true spirit of this holiday. It's a time to give thanks for the many blessings in our lives, but it's also a time to remember those who are not as fortunate, especially the hostages kept in Gaza for 48 days.

On October 7th, a horrific attack on Israel by Hamas led to the abduction of 240 individuals from their homes into Gaza, casting a shadow over their lives and over us all.

This empty chair at our table symbolizes our commitment to keeping the issue of hostages in Gaza in our hearts and homes.

By keeping this issue in our thoughts, we can help raise awareness and support efforts to bring these hostages back home. Our collective empathy and compassion can make a real difference in their lives and in our world.

As part of the Seats of Hope Campaign, we'd like to share the story of one of the hostages for whom we've reserved an empty chair.

Nili Margalit is a pediatric nurse who worked at Soroka hospital. Nili always arrived at the hospital with fresh produce that was grown on the kibbutz.

She was kidnapped by Hamas terrorists from her home in Kibbutz Nir Oz. While initially feared to be dead, one of the women who was released by Hamas disclosed that they were held together and that Nili is treating people who are being held hostage and injured.

Let us hold in our hearts the hope for the safe return of all hostages, and may our collective efforts bring them back to their families soon.
